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Disabled Children And The Law

Title II requires that State and local governments give people with disabilities an equal opportunity to benefit from all of their programs, services, and activities (e.g. public education, employment, transportation, recreation, health care, social services, courts, voting, and town meetings).

Three major federal laws protect the rights of people with disabilities. They are IDEA, Section 504, and ADA. IDEA is the law that provides IEPs.

Disability Law: Which Laws Do What?

Children with a disability are entitled by law to receive an appropriate education designed to meet their special needs. They must be separated from their nondisabled peers only when the nature of the disability is such that they cannot achieve in a general education classroom, even with supplementary aids and supports.

The Laws that Protect Your Child With Special Needs

Federal law mandates that each and every child is to receive an education that is both free and appropriate in an environment that is the least restrictive possible. In order to support the ability of students with disabilities to learn in school, there are three federal laws that apply specifically to students with disabilities.

A child is permanently and totally disabled if both of the following apply: He or she cannot engage in any substantial gainful activity because of a physical or mental condition and A doctor determines the condition has lasted or can be expected to last continuously for at least a year or can lead to death.
