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Heart Failure And Palliative Care

Palliative care, sometimes now referred to as supportive care, is specialized care that focuses on improving quality of life (QOL) through relief of stress and symptoms for patients with serious illness. 1 While most often associated with oncology, palliative care is appropriate for any patient in the advanced stages of illness, including patients with heart failure (HF).

The Palliative Care in Heart Failure (PAL-HF; NCT01589601) trial is a prospective, controlled, unblinded, single center study of an interdisciplinary palliative care intervention in 200 patients with advanced heart failure estimated to have a high likelihood of mortality or readmission.

One problem with utilization of palliative care for an unpredictable disease trajectory such as heart failure, is the conceptualization within the health care field that palliative care is a formal care delivery service introduced at end of life and not a philosophy of care 17 for a person who needs services throughout an ultimately terminal illness trajectory.

Integration of a palliative approach to heart failure EOL care helps to ensure patients receive the care that is congruent with their values, wishes and preferences. Specialist palliative care referrals are limited to those who are truly at heart failure EOL.

However, even with these developments, many patients with heart failure are unlikely to benefit from a referral to expert services such as palliative care.1 The National Service Framework (NSF) for Coronary Heart Disease recommends that a palliative care intervention be included in end-stage disease, and this is now widely recognised in the NHS.
